Nolte kitchens let you match working height to how tall you are. While standing, the most comfortable working height is when the distance between worktop and bent elbow is approx. 15 cm. Variable plinth heights, different carcass heights and three worktop thicknesses make it possible to provide an ergonomic working height for persons of any stature.
